In some sense, we are participating in what John Wesley would call - "Christian Conferencing" - a gathering for mutual support, accountability and challenge for discipleship and evangelism.

We are so pleased to have with us, Dr. David Busic, and Christi, as our presiding General Superintendent in jurisdiction. This is our second, and final, year with Dr. Busic guiding and leading us in our time together. We are so blessed in our structure and polity to have such wonderful leaders journey with us in mission. Looking forward to his sharing the Word with us and whatever else God has laid upon his heart to share. Please continue to lift him in prayer and remember to thank them for their investment in the NED and in the kingdom.

Our theme continues to be NEMA - New England Missional Adventure. Our focus is Our Call, Our Context, Our Challenge taken from John 4:35 - "Do you not say, 'Four more months and then the harvest'? I tell you, open your eyes (Call) and look at the fields! (Context) They are ripe for harvest." (Challenge)

This year our emphasis is "Living into the Loving Imagination of God" The book of Genesis points out "In the beginning, God created..." and thus the narrative begins, at least for us who are locked in finite time, of God who loves, creates, imagines, calls into being out of nothing. This grand story of God's love weaves it's way through humanity, bad choices, broken relationship(s), unfaithfulness (big time), loss of identity, and so on... And once again God's love responds in such a way that Paul would express as such - "But when the time had fully come, God sent His Son, born of a woman, born under law, to redeem those under law, that we might receive the full rights of sons. Because you are sons, God sent the Spirit of His Son into our hearts, the Spirit who calls out, 'Abba, Father.' So you are no longer a slave, but a son; and since you are a son, God has made you also an heir." (Galatians 4:4-7)

If we are indeed "Christ's ambassadors," and if we have indeed been given the "ministry of reconciliation," and if we have indeed been given the "message of reconciliation," and if indeed "Christ's love compels us," and if we indeed "regard no one from a worldly point of view," and if we truly believe in our Wesleyan roots of prevenient grace - whereby God's grace is actively engaged all around us - then we have the incredible privilege of "living into the loving imagination of God."

So what does that look like in our context? Well hopefully His Spirit will speak to our hearts during our brief time together and we will discover, or re-discover, what Bryan Stone calls an "ecclesial imagination" (Evangelism after Pluralism). That we would live as expressions of God's great love and that in "inviting the world to come and see the newness of which it is (the good news), the church calls attention to a contrasting identity in Christ and to what the world (and indeed the church) might become."

Blessings on you this day - especially if you've read this far - and in the hours we have together - **living into the loving imagination of God!**

Sunday School and Discipleship Ministries International Chairperson

Dr. Busic, Rev. Stanford, delegates and friends of the assembly, it is a privilege to give my eighth and final report as Sunday School and Discipleship Ministries (SDMI) chairperson for the New England District. My passion for Sunday School and Discipleship has not diminished; in fact, if anything, it has increased. I hope to continue being involved with SDMI on the district level but with a narrower focus. I am confident that the board will continue to support local church ministries with even greater effectiveness under new leadership.

SDMI and The Great Commission . . .

Our goal as your District Sunday School and Discipleship Ministries Board is to support local churches in carrying out Christ's Great Commission. The Great Commission gives two components to making disciples: baptizing and teaching. SDMI encompasses both in its mission. While we do not administer the sacrament of baptism, SDMI is concerned with evangelism and teaching—bringing the unchurched into a saving knowledge of Jesus Christ, preparing them for baptism and teaching or discipling them afterwards for a life of holiness, i.e. making Christlike disciples. To this end, everything we do must lend support in one of these broad categories: evangelism and discipleship. When we consider a program, a curriculum or a fresh way of doing ministry, it must either contribute directly to evangelism and/or discipleship or it must support those who doing this work. Following are some of the ways SDMI seeks to meet these goals.

Adult Ministries

Adult Ministries Council comprises ministries to adults of all ages and stages of life. At present we have active Men's and Women's ministries. We hope to address ministries to Prime Timers, Single Adults, and Young Adults – and others such as Marriage and Family as leaders come forward. With the retirement of Ed DiSante at the end of last year after several years of faithful service the adult leadership position remains open.

Men's and Women's Ministries

Men's Ministries has had a quiet year; however, plans are in the works for this summer. Director Brian Case is also looking to form a men's council to help plan, implement and carry out meaningful events. expressed his heart in a recent report to the board:

"Looking ahead to the next year there are a few events I'd like to see happen to help build this planning team and encourage men in our churches to pray for their church, their pastor or pastors, and their community. To think of ways they can reach the men of their communities, recently as I've been praying, I can't help but think, how different my community (Rutland, VT) would look if as a church we could reach absent fathers. How can we begin to have these kinds of conversations across our district? One idea I have is either area Men's breakfast or BBQ at different churches across our district, just need a church in each area to host it."

Brian has announced a Mountain Climb for July 13th (rain date July 20). Men are invited to gather at the summit of Mount Washington – the highest point on our district – to pray for New England.

We are grateful to Brian for his prayerful planning and concern for effective ministry to men.

Women's Ministries

Women's Ministries held its annual Women's Fall Retreat and final gathering at Windsor Hills in October. Eighty-five women gathered to share in the fun, fellowship, and spiritual enrichment. The Reverend Dr. Christi Bennett spoke on the theme "Miss Anonymous" highlighting how God worked in the lives of little-known women of the Bible, providing for them and empowering them to do extraordinary deeds. Newly appointed director Sharon Desrochers is in the process of pulling together a team to plan the next retreat as well as future activities.

Retreats and similar events focus primarily on enriching fellowship, encouragement, and spiritual growth but also offer opportunities for inviting pre-Christian friends as well. Women's Ministries also provides Bible Study and discipleship resources specifically designed for women.

Children's Ministries

Kids' Camp

Our final year of Kids Camp at Windsor Hills was a resounding success as 81 campers and 29 staff gathered to experience an exciting time of fun and laughter, friendships and learning activities, quiet times of prayer with cabin groups or alone with God. Rev. Kurt Fleming spoke on the theme *Metamorphosis* and Bible Quizzing leaders introduced the 2018-2019 theme – Acts - through song and a daily memory verse. The Bible Quizzing activity period, a favorite with campers, gives campers a further introduction to the Quizzing experience as they role play stories and practice answering questions.

Last summer for the first time we partnered with Angel Tree Ministries, an arm of Prison Fellowship that ministers to the children of prisoners. Angel Tree provided scholarships of \$200 each for six campers, each of whom has a parent currently or formerly incarcerated. Three of these were new campers who otherwise would not have been able to attend camp. Participation in this program not only helps children attend camp

but provides an avenue of ministry to their families through the local church. We are most grateful for this program and plan to continue the partnership for the foreseeable future.

We are indebted to the local churches on our district for their participation in camping ministry through encouraging children to attend, providing scholarships and sending staff. We are deeply indebted to each counselor and staff member who gives a week of their time and energy for this rewarding but challenging ministry to our children. Kids Camp wouldn't happen without you! Last but certainly not least, we are grateful for the capable and dynamic leadership of director Barb Calhoun. Thank you, Barb!

We look forward to Kids Camp 2019 to be held at Camp Berea in Lyman, ME August 4 – 8. The Reverend Dr. Christi Bennett will be our chapel speaker. Christi grew up on the New England District and we are delighted that she is coming back to minister to our children this summer. There will undoubtedly be some challenges as we move to a new location and work with new management, but we are confident that God will bless with his presence. Our goal, as always, is that children will come to know Jesus Christ and grow in their knowledge of him.

Children's Bible Quizzing

We regret to report that participation in Children's Bible Quizzing has continued to decline this year with only 11 children from four churches or areas participating. While there may be several reasons for this sharp decline, the primary one appears to be the lack of adult leaders. Children continue to be enthusiastic as noted in the camp report. Learning the Bible story and memorizing scripture is a key element in spiritual formation for children. Today, more than ever, children need to hear God's Word and hide it in their hearts. If we fail in this, we fail to in our God-given mission! While Bible Quizzing is not the only way to help children learn and memorize scripture, it is an excellent way that is readily available to us. Moreover the curriculum gives an overview of the Bible story over the six-year cycle. If not Bible Quizzing, what? How are the children in your church learning scripture? We encourage pastors and children's leaders to consider making Bible Quizzing a central part of their ministry to children. Thank you, director Brandyy Fernandes for your continued efforts in this vital area of ministry.

Continued Lay Training (CLT)/Discipleship Place

The Church of the Nazarene has always believed in an educated laity. That emphasis continues today with <u>The Discipleship Place</u> offering more resources than ever before, many of them online. There are a wide range of Bible studies and training materials ranging from curriculum for small group studies, training courses for both students and teachers to webinars hosted by knowledgeable presenters in topics of concern to laity and pastors alike. CLT courses cover every aspect of ministry: Adult and Lay Ministry,

Children's Ministry, Youth Ministry, Organic Church, Membership and Coaching. We can have a trained laity in our churches! We encourage every pastor and SDMI leader and teacher to sign up with the Discipleship place and keep abreast of the excellent resources you will find there.

Curriculum

This seems an appropriate place to include a word about teaching curriculum. A vast array of curriculum resources is available to us today via the internet. We, as your SDMI board, would like to encourage – even admonish – local churches to carefully choose teaching materials that are in harmony with our Wesleyan-Arminian theology. The Foundry Publishing (formerly Nazarene Publishing House) offers excellent, graded Sunday School curriculum for Children, Adults, Young Adults, and Youth as well as resources for Vacation Bible School, mid-week activities, families and more. Please stop by the SDMI table in the Café Connection to review some of the Foundry curriculum materials on display.

District Leadership Days

We were disappointed by the cancellation of the Day of NED with Dr. David Fitch last November due to low registration. However we look forward to the upcoming Day of NED with Reggie Jackson, scheduled for November 4-5, 2019. Many of us are reading his book, *Kingdom Collaborators: Eight Signature Practices of Leaders Who Turn the World Upside Down*, in preparation for this event. Hopefully, every church has these dates on its calendar and pastors are making it a priority to attend with their leadership. We need to be continually raising up leaders who are both committed to the cause of Christ and effective in inspiring others to action.

SDMI Leadership Conference

Mary Lou Shea attended the three-day SDMI Leadership Conference held in Cincinnati this past September and brought back a multitude of resources along with a thoughtful and thorough report. We printed a short excerpt was printed in the October Café Connection newsletter under the title *Discipleship Makes A Difference* in which she shared thoughts from a message by General Superintendent Dr. Fili Chambo. They are worth repeating here:

"... God promises to push everything out of the way to find us; the Trinity pursues us so that we can be part of the family of God. When Christ died on the cross, He defeated the Power of Death and Sin, and unleashed the Power of God in the world for our transformation. This is done, not to come one day. We must keep the message alive! There is power in the name of Jesus!

Discipleship makes the difference, especially in times of trial! Do not retreat! Stand firm, even in the face of punishment or isolation, relying not on

our strength, but that of the Holy Spirit. God's passion is that we live in Him and He in us. Holiness is more powerful than sin. Death, Evil, Sin, Satan — these have no power to defeat God, and they cannot defeat us if we live in God and welcome Him to dwell in us. We must empty ourselves as Christ did, inviting others to meet Christ by pouring out His love, power, grace and hope. The lost can be close at hand, wandering about, trapped in the propaganda of this age, of Sin and Death. If we live as Christ did, we will be in the midst of the lost, showing the Way."

Looking Ahead

The mission of SDMI is "to carry out the Great Commission to children, youth, and adults in preparation for a lifetime of Christian holiness." The challenge is immense-even overwhelming – and would seem impossible were it not for the fact that Jesus himself gave his disciples this mission and he promised to be with them wherever they went. The mission and the promise are for us as well. Whatever we do, we do in the power and presence of the Holy Spirit.

The board is looking at how we can best be a resource for our churches in the days ahead. At present, we are considering area gatherings for inspiration, practical training and mutual encouragement. We invite pastors, leaders and teachers to let us know how we can best serve you. At this assembly we are planning a lunch or dinner meeting for SDMI Directors to meet for orientation and networking. We hope this will be the beginning of a continuing communication and sharing among Sunday School and Discipleship leaders across the district. We really do need each other!

Closing Thoughts

I am personally thankful for God's call and his empowering presence in my life. I am grateful for the encouragement and support of the SDMI board members, some of whom I have already mentioned in this report. All are listed below. Each one brings unique gifts and life experience to the task. All bring a passion for sharing the gospel of Jesus Christ. Thank you, Board! I am thankful for our district leadership: our district superintendent and district secretary, the other department heads with whom we join hands in ministry. Thank you, Ken, Gerry, Phil & Mike. I am grateful for your leadership and support. I am thankful for each pastor, SDMI leader and teacher in the churches across our district. You are always a source of joy and inspiration to me as you share what God is doing in your lives and in your churches. Finally, I am thankful to my husband Bruce who faithfully supports me in the work God has called me to do and to my prayer partners who pray with me for the concerns and hopes I share with them and, then, rejoice with me in the joys and enthusiastic reports of this ministry.

NED NMI President's Report 2019

Honored guests, delegates and friends of the New England District Nazarene Missions International. This is my 11th report as your president here on the New England District. Eleven years ago I was voted to serve in this lead position and I want to thank you for the opportunity to serve you all. I love Nazarene Missions International. But more importantly I love the people that we send to those also who we all love — the Lost!

One of the teachers of the law...asked him, "Of all the commandments, which is the most important?" "The most important one," answered Jesus,... "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind and with all your strength. The second is this: 'Love your neighbor as yourself.' There is no commandment greater than these."

Mark 12:28-31

This is why we do what we do.

I'm happy to be able to tell you once again that in this past year of 2018-2019 New England District Nazarenes did their best to accomplish, both here and around the world, the "Making of Disciples in the Nations." We did what we've been doing since we learned about and chose to be apart of Nazarene Missions. We prayed... we gave... we educated... we went... we loved... all this because we believe! And we've wondered what was next. Tomorrow we begin to answer that question as we hear about "A Movement of God Through the People of God!"

In our giving, as of May 13h, from "Funding the Mission," I received the following information.

Now the World Evangelism Fund giving came to 4.66% of our base income. To reach the 5.5% we would need to give an additional \$79,533.89. Even for the New England District to make 90% of our goal we would need to give an additional \$27,336. You may fault me for this but I've

never really been concerned with reaching monetary goals because I know the Lord provides where there is a need. Overall, as of May 13th, our base income received from all of our churches was up .1% over last year (2017-2018). But you need to know that more has come in since I wrote this report (May 13th). Please also notice that giving to Missions Specials has drastically decreased over the previous year possibly due to fewer natural disasters worldwide. But when you total what we gave to WEF and add Mission Specials to that the total giving is \$817,035.72. That's a lot of money!

But that's just giving which is just one pillar of the four pillars of NMI - Prayer, Giving, Education, and Engaging Children and Youth. Over this past year we began to pray for our leaders as they compiled information received from all over the globe to come up with the next reinvention of Nazarene Missions. Prayer is what really matters because it taps into the power of God! I would like to ask all of you to prioritize praying for Nazarene Missions. Make attending the District NMI Prayer Luncheon an event that "you want to attend" not an event that "you won't want to miss."

Last year we only had one Children's Jamboree and that was in Connecticut at the Hartford First Church of the Nazarene. Barbara Basdeo has always made this a priority and with the team she had it was a great success. But if I know Barbara, I know she bathed the event in prayer. The Children's Jamboree is not a gift of mine like it was with Gerry Perry. We used to have hundreds of kids that attended the event when it was at the Christian Academy for the South Shore. In recognizing that this was something that all of us needed to be apart, at our last District NMI Council Meeting, I admitted that this was not an area where I was able and asked for their help, thoughts, and ideas. What came out of that meeting was young leaders stepping out of their comfort zones and considering hosting the event at the Lowell Church of the Nazarene. I'm still not sure if this is going to fully happen so I would like all of you to begin to pray for this new Children's Jamboree.

God is putting together something new here in New England and we all need to choose to be apart of it. God is speaking. Are you listening? God is asking. Are you willing? Will you pray like you've never prayed before? Will you desire to give like you've never given before? Where will you begin? What will you do? Only He knows ... Listen as He speaks.

- 9 Discussed alternative ways to assess church planters with an ongoing commitment to provide greater support via assessments, trainings, and coaching.

Finance Committee

We your District Finance Committee, submit the following recommendations for your approval.

- 1. Funding the Mission for the District Unified Fund, the Education Fund, the Pension and Benefits Fund and the World Evangelism Fund will be calculated in accordance with the process and percentages set and approved by the General Church, the District Finance Committee and the District Advisory Board as follows:
 - a. The base for each Local Church is established by taking the total income, subtracting designated World Evangelism Fund contributions and approved 10% Mission specials. Income is defined as all funds given to the church that are considered charitable gifts in accordance with IRS publication 526. Questions and answers about what qualifies as income are available on line at www.fundingthemission.org. All pastors and one other individual should register to access the website, www.fundingthemission.org.

For example:

Total Income for the 1st two Sundays of April 1-15 = \$2,000.00 (Includes WEF and 10% Specials)

WEF Income for the 1st two Sundays of April = 300.00 10% Specials Income for the 1st two Sundays of April = 50.00

Base = \$2,000.00 - \$300.00 - \$50.00 = \$1,650.00

The Base is: \$1.650.00

b. The Base will be multiplied by the following percentages for Funding the Mission in the following areas:

District Unified Fund 5.5% (.055)
World Evangelism Fund 5.5% (.055)
Education Fund 2.25% (.0225)
Pensions and Benefits Fund 2.25% (.0225)

Funding the Mission percentage will total 15.5%. For example, using the base from above of \$1,650.00, the calculations would be as follows:

District Unified Fund = $$1,650.00 \times .055 = 90.75 WEF = $$1,650.00 \times .055 = 90.75 Education fund = $$1,650.00 \times .0225 = 37.13 Pensions & Ben. Fund = $$1,650.00 \times .0225 = 37.13

The District requests that the amount due to the District be sent no less frequently than every month.

The District also encourages local churches to use the www.fundingthemission.org website to enter church income and utilize the site to make Funding the Mission payments. All payments, with the exception of the Education fund, can be made through the website. If a church needs to sign up for this site, please feel free to contact the district treasurer, George Eknaian.

- c. Unusual circumstances involving large gifts that are clearly outside the church's normal activity will be considered for an adjustment to church income. Requests for adjustment must be made during the affected assembly year and approved by the district superintendent and District Advisory Board. Upon district approval, a leadership team at the Global Ministry Center will consider the request based on the circumstances, church-giving patterns, and history of denominational faithfulness. Some examples of unusual circumstances are available on line at www.fundingthemission.org.
- 2. All New Starts and churches which have been organized for less than one full assembly year will give to others by sending their tithe (10% of their offerings) to the district. The district will distribute that money to "Funding the Mission" according to the allocation schedule discussed in #1 above with the received money being the Base. New Starts and newly organized churches are encouraged to participate in missions giving opportunities such as Thanksgiving and Easter offerings, Alabaster, Crisis Care Kits, etc.
- 3. The District Budget is based on 100% of the projected receipts for the Unified Fund due to a projected budget shortfall if the 90% assumption were used.
- 4. The District Mission Education Assignment (DMEA) which supports the District NMI will no longer be paid separately from the District Unified Fund as was approved by the District Assembly in 2014. It will be taken from the Unified Fund according to the percentages in #5 below.
- 5. The Unified Fund will continue to meet the needs of many of district missional functions in addition to district operations, as seen below. The amounts received by the missional functions listed below are a percentage of the total amount received by the District Unified Fund. A church may choose to make an additional offering to one of the missional functions of the district in addition to their percentage sent to the Unified fund. The distribution of the Unified Fund will be as follows:

59.0 % (.590)
18.4 % (.184)
3.8 % (.038)
2.9 % (.029)
2.9 % (.029)
13.0 % (.130)

The district office will report to the local churches the payments on the Unified Fund at the area brunches/dinners and through quarterly emails to pastors and treasurers.

6. The Education Fund for Eastern Nazarene College is addressed under 1b. above. Churches should encourage their members and friends to make additional gifts to ENC in compliance with employer "matching gifts" programs. A booklet is available through the ENC Development Office listing the companies involved in this program.

- 7. All subordinate organizations of the District (Nazarene Youth International, Sunday School & Discipleship Ministries International Board, Nazarene Missions International, and any other applicable boards and committees):
 - a. Shall submit a projected Budget for the coming year by March 1, 2020, and shall include a current cash flow statement (balance at the start of the year, statement of income, statement of expenditures, and balance on hand) for the review and approval of the district office.
 - b. Shall not allocate any form of compensation for individuals in their Funds that could be interpreted as wages by the IRS, without first requesting specific review of the financial impact and liability by the district office.
- 8. The district treasurer will submit a monthly written financial report to the district superintendent and the District Advisory Board.
- 9. All boards, councils, and official committees will reimburse, upon request their members, for travel, preferably at the IRS allowance per mile, plus tolls, and meal expenses incurred by attendance at meetings.
- 10. Audit of district and Local Church Financial Records:
 - a. All financial records of the district and local churches will be internally reviewed prior to the convening of the district assembly, and that these records appear in the "Financial and Statistical" section of the assembly journal.
 - b. All financial records of the district and local churches will be reviewed by an outside agency, an individual volunteer, or a paid individual every year, and that these records appear in the "Financial Statistical" section of the assembly journal. ("Outside agency...or individual..."can be an unpaid treasurer/bookkeeper or other qualified person from another church on the district or a paid CPA/auditor.)
- 11. The District Advisory Board will provide, on request by the local churches, assistance in financial management.

Pastoral Support - Clergy Health Committee

The district office and the pastoral support committee want to assist pastors and church boards in understanding their roles in providing adequate compensation for its pastors and staff. Support of the pastor by the church is an expression of the belief in the call of God on the life of the pastor rather than a job where monies are paid for services rendered. Adequate compensation enables a pastor to fulfill his or her calling.

Pastoral support extends beyond the cash salary, housing provision and benefits of the senior pastor and staff pastors. Support also includes the expenses incurred by the pastor necessary to conduct the business of the church and is thus an expense of the local church and not pastoral income.

The district pastoral support committee has developed guidelines for local church boards and pastoral support committees to evaluate their commitment to the ministry of the pastor. Each local church should conduct an annual review of the pastoral package and benefits. If you would like further assistance in assessing or planning adequate compensation, contact the district office.

In addition to consideration for the local pastors, churches should establish a remuneration policy for pulpit supply, including travel expenses.

Categories of Ministry

We embrace various categories of pastoral ministry related to the local church and affirm the value and calling of each in making Christlike disciples in the nations.

Senior Pastor or Lead Pastor

The senior pastor is the leader of the church and a leader in the local community.

Co-Pastors

Co-pastors are two or more credentialed ministers who share equal authority and responsibility in ministry (albeit not the same roles) to a church. The term "Co-pastors" refers to a credentialed ministry team that is not limited to, but often is a married couple.

In the process of calling co-pastors, the role and compensation package for each co-pastor is to be negotiated and clearly defined by the church board, district superintendent, and co-pastors.

The New England District recognizes the unique call God places on some married couples in pastoral ministry. In the event a church calls one person of a credentialed couple, the church should not expect the other credentialed spouse to assume any pastoral responsibilities. Alternatively, if the ministry couple so desires, and with the agreement of the board and district superintendent, roles and responsibilities may be defined for the ministry couple without increase to a singular compensation package provided by the church.

Bi-vocational Pastor

A bi-vocational pastor supplements income by other means in addition to church compensation. Churches should review the circumstances that result in the need to supplement pastoral income as an opportunity to plan for the future growth of the church, including the goal of increased pastoral support to better enable the pastor to attend to the work of ministry in keeping with this sacred calling. Recognizing that some churches may be best served by a bi-vocational pastor, each should annually review steps to ensure the best care of their pastor as possible, coupled with the worthy goal of full support.

Associate Pastor and Staff

An associate pastor is defined as a "partner in ministry" on staff. Associate pastors and staff are to receive a similar benefit package as the senior pastor. Associate pastor and staff salaries should be negotiated in accordance with the recommendations of the senior pastor.

Retired Pastor

A retired pastor is a minister with retirement status. We recommend that retired pastors be employed for pulpit supply as frequently as possible. Retired pastors live on meager retirement benefits and may welcome the opportunity to provide for pulpit supply. Retired pastors are a source of experience and expertise that is available to the local church.

Evangelist

Often, the evangelist's only source of income is from meetings held at various local churches. We recommend that full-time evangelist's remuneration be an amount equal to twice the local senior pastor's weekly cash salary for each full Sunday in the special meeting as recommended by the Evangelism Ministries of the USA Canada Mission/Evangelism Department. The local senior pastor's weekly cash salary and prorated insurance and social security benefits should be included in the compensation. Additional compensation for housing and travel-related expenses should be paid in a separate check, allowing for maximum tax benefit for the evangelist.

The following sections describe the main components of the cost of ministry in the support of the pastor.

The Church of the Nazarene Pensions & Benefits website includes several memos and articles that the church board will find helpful in consideration of pastoral compensation and tax-related issues. In final decision-making, these guidelines are not intended to serve as tax advice and pastors and church boards should direct questions regarding tax issues to a qualified consultant. 1. Compensation

The compensation component of the cost of ministry provides the ability to care for the pastor's personal responsibilities. The pastor's salary and benefits are a priority in the expenditure of local funds. Compensation must be reviewed annually, at least prior to the annual meeting, as required by the Manual* [paragraph 129.8 states: To determine the amount of remuneration and benefits, including retirement benefits, the pastor shall receive, and to review them at least once a year.]. The preferable review would be in the January meeting of the Church Board. Any proposed adjustments should be included in the annual church budget. Refer to the Pensions and Benefits USA Memo #4: Strategies for Structuring Ministerial Compensation.

Compensation should reflect the pastor's position within the local church and within the community. Compensation should also reflect the length of experience, level of education, demonstration of capability, productivity, length of service, and level of success in the management of the local church resources. Churches should strive to pay a salary that allows the pastor to devote full-time to the work to which God has called him or her. Gender is not to be a compensation issue.

The district office has assembled a package for local churches to use when calling a pastor to a new pastorate. The district superintendent will furnish this package to the local pastoral support committee before the new pastor arrives. The district office also can provide comparative amounts for the New England District churches (including staff positions), the denominational amounts as a whole and by region, and trans-denomination amounts in various categories (monies raised, membership, location, and so on).

It is advisable for a total amount for the compensation, which includes cash salary, housing provision, and benefits to be established by the church board annually. The distribution of the package should be made in consultation with the pastor taking into consideration tax provisions.

When a pastor's spouse is working and has insurance benefits (such as medical insurance) that may include the ministry spouse and family members, and it is financially advantageous to do so, the church should pay any additional premium that is required. This premium would be a part of the benefit portion of the compensation package. Any savings that may accrue from such action should not decrease the total compensation package but be credited toward salary and/or other benefits.

1.a. Cash Salary

This is the amount of money the pastor receives in his or her paycheck. Salary paid on a weekly basis provides maximum flexibility for the pastor.

The local church finance committee (or its equivalent) should consult with the local pastoral support committee (or its equivalent) as they prepare the annual budget. The local Church Board pastoral support committee needs to review the pastoral compensation package, considering a cost of living and merit increase, proposing the increase to the Finance Committee early enough to allow its inclusion in the annual budget for the upcoming fiscal church year. Particular care should be taken not to grant an increase in salary effective during the current fiscal year if provision has not been made in the budget to accommodate the increase.

It is important to note that failure to provide a cost of living increase to the pastor actually results in a salary reduction equal to the inflation experienced during the year in question. This is why cost of living and merit increases should be simultaneously considered.

1.b. Housing Allowance

This is the amount of money that is paid towards housing allowance for those churches that do not provide a parsonage. A housing allowance must be approved before any disbursement and is never retroactive. This action should be recorded annually in board minutes, and clearly stated in a church budget which becomes part of the permanent record of the church board.

The value of a church-provided parsonage (or housing allowance) is not included as income for income tax purposes, but is included in the total income for Social Security Tax purposes. 'Where a parsonage is provided, the Church Board should declare the fair rental value of the parsonage, including utilities, and record this in the minutes. This should be reviewed annually.

Note: If not included in the local church expense budget, churches that have a parsonage may (and are encouraged to) provide an allowance for housing-related expenses such as furniture and furnishings, utilities and maintenance.

Refer to Pension and Benefits USA Memo #1: <u>Housing for Your Pastor: Parsonage or Housing Allowance?</u> for information about the pros and cons of parsonages and housing allowances. See also Pension and Benefits USA Memo #13: *The Minister's Housing Allowance*.

2. Benefits

Benefits provide the pastor with a level of security for today (with health insurance) and for tomorrow (with retirement planning).

2.a. Insurance

This is the amount of money the church pays to provide medical, life, and professional insurance for the pastor and his or her family. Contact Pensions and Benefits USA for more information about Nazarene Long-Term Disability Insurance, Nazarene Supplemental Group Term Life Insurance, and Nazarene Accidental Death and Dismemberment Insurance.

2.a.1. Medical Insurance

It is important to note that according to the Affordable Healthcare Act the local church is responsible to be sure their pastoral family and pastoral staff family have "credible healthcare coverage".[For more information regarding this act: http://www.hhs.gov/healthcare/facts-and-features/state-by-state/index.html .

This is the amount of money the church pays to cover health and medical expenses. The amount of money specified for medical coverage is a tax-free benefit. If the medical coverage does not provide for a physical examination of the pastor(s), the church should cover the expense of a physical examination at least once every two years. Some insurers cover both health and medical services; some provide them separately. Health and medical plans vary widely in cost. A pastor or church may find a medical plan which may suit the pastor's insurance needs but may not cover all medical costs. A church may

then opt to cover the "uncovered" medical expenses not covered on an "as incurred" basis with a total cap. This could be through the establishment of a medical savings plan. Some medical plans may not be locally recognized by the health care provider to pay for the service when it is rendered, causing the pastor to pay out of pocket and wait to be reimbursed. In such cases, the church should incur the immediate expense, relieving this burden from the pastor, and receive the reimbursement.

2.a.2 Mental Health Care

A pastor confronts multiple demands, and works in a rather isolated environment, which can contribute to mental health concerns such as depression, anxiety, and acute stress. The New England District Church of the Nazarene affirms the value of mental health services and psychotherapy when a pastor experiences acute stress or symptoms of a mental health concern.

A church should provide adequate health insurance to pay for services, including a fund to help support the cost of needed services.

Also, a pastor, with the support of the local church, should develop a self-care plan that includes healthy patterns of rest, sleep, nutrition, exercise, recreation, psychological assessment resources, healthy bi-vocational balance, and so on, because healthy self-care practices are a foundation to one's physical and mental health.

2.a.3. Long Term Disability (Medical Leave)

The church should provide a long-term disability plan for its pastor(s).

2.a.4. Worker's Compensation

The local church must be aware that most states have compulsory participation laws for worker's compensation insurance. It is imperative that the church complies with the state law in this matter. This insurance covers work-related accident, injury, or illness of the pastor and other paid staff. See Pensions and Benefits USA *Memo #9: Worker's Compensations Laws and the Local Church.*

2.a.5. Life Insurance

This is the amount of money the church pays for life insurance. Many companies provide life insurance as a company paid benefit and the church should provide this benefit directly. The church may provide up to \$50,000 of group life insurance as a tax-free benefit. Premiums for coverage above this amount are taxable. [You may want to check into Pastor's Life Insurance Plan/Provisioners Death Benefit Plan through P&B.]

2.a.6. Professional Insurance

The church should provide a professional insurance rider on the church liability policy for the pastor with attention given to exclusionary clauses. The church should ensure that its liability insurance includes coverage for allegations of sexual abuse. In today's society where some people look for reasons to sue, the church needs to take steps to protect itself and the pastor.

2.b. Retirement Planning

This is the amount of money paid into a retirement account for the pastor each year. Retirement planning is important for your pastor. The church should help its pastor to plan for retirement years. Information about the Nazarene 403(b) Retirement Savings Plan is available through P&B-USA; http://pbusa.org/index.php/retirement-overview.

2.b.1. Social Security

For tax purposes, pastors are considered self-employed and must pay the full Social Security tax on their income. In business, companies pay half and the employee pays half. The local church should reimburse the pastor for at least one half of the self-employment Social Security tax. We recommend that the church pay the full Social Security tax. The IRS considers this reimbursement as an allowance and therefore taxable income. See Pension and Benefits USA *Memo #10*: <u>Can Ministers Opt Out of Social Security?</u>

2.b.2 . Retirement 403(b) Accounts

Social Security benefits alone will not cover retirement living costs. Retired ministers need supplemental income. 403(b) accounts provide tax shelter to the pastor and enable a church to provide for its pastor in retirement years. *Note:* 403(b) accounts are subject to a percentage of the base salary.

2.c. Vacation and Time Off

Pastors should be encouraged to use their vacations and time off to care for the needs of their families, to get away from the "office" and to rejuvenate themselves. The pastor's and congregation's health and ministry are best served by the pastor taking their vacation benefit consistently.

Time spent at district camps and other district functions and general assembly should not be counted as vacation or time off because attendances at these functions are part of the pastor's office duties. Recommended *minimum* vacation allowances are:

- Three weeks* for 1-4 years of service
- Four weeks* for 5-10 years of service
- Five weeks* for 11-15 years of service
- Six weeks* for 16 or more years of service
 *a week includes one Sunday

("Years of service" refers to the number of years in full-time ministry throughout the pastor's life; not only his/her tenure in the present local church.)

Vacation time should not be cumulative; it should be used in the year in which it was earned. Vacation time should be taken prior to the last Sunday in a pastor's ministry to a congregation before a pastoral change. Any unused vacation time should be worked out between the pastor, the district superintendent, and the church board prior to the announcement of a pastoral transition.

2.d. Maternity or Paternity Leave (*Manual** paragraph 116)

Affirming the value of family and the importance of pastors modeling peaceful and integrated lives, local churches should consider providing a maternity or paternity leave for the pastor and associates.

Such policies may contain the following provisions:

 Timing and duration of maternity or paternity leave should be determined by mutual agreement of the pastor and church board prior to anticipated childbirth or adoption placement.

- Maternity or paternity leave should be considered in addition to and separately from vacation.
- The local church should consult with the pastor and district superintendent to arrange for a supply pastor during the period of maternity or paternity leave.
- During maternity or paternity leave the pastor's full salary and benefits continue. Any other arrangement shall be placed in writing and signed by the pastor, secretary of the church board, and the district superintendent.

2.e. Sabbaticals & Sabbath Practice

Pastors, with the support of their church, should be encouraged to seek time for rest, renewal and purposeful development of their calling throughout the duration of their ministry. Believing that the responsibility of Sabbath practice enhances the ministry of a pastor over the long-term, a well-thought out Sabbath practice should be made by the pastor in consultation with the church board. This may include weekly (day off), quarterly (sermon & vision planning, individual and group spiritual formation retreats, etc.), and extended sabbatical (every seventh year).

From *Manual** Paragraph 129.10:

In order to encourage a healthy pastoral ministry and strong spiritual life of the pastor, the church board, in consultation with the district superintendent, should provide a sabbatical leave for the pastor during each seventh consecutive year of service in one congregation. The timing and duration of the sabbatical shall be determined in consultation with the pastor, church board and district superintendent.

Components of an effective sabbatical may include a variety of items such as intentional time for rest away from regular duties, a pulpit exchange with another pastor off the district, specific ministry-enhancing courses at an accredited university or seminary, or visiting other churches with a planned purpose (for example, to study different forms of worship, different forms of ministry, and so on). The gift of a sabbatical is a loving investment in ministerial wellness benefiting both the pastor and the church. Additional resources for the development of a sabbatical plan as well as contact information for pastors who are familiar with a sabbatical process are available through the district office and at www.nazarenepastor.org.

2.f. Bonuses

This is the amount of money the church pays each year in the form of a bonus. Churches are encouraged to consider annual bonuses. All bonuses are taxable income. Any gift that is included in the church's financial records, and is especially receipted as charitable giving is always taxable income.

2.g. Expressions of Appreciation

Tangible reminders of appreciation, such as gifts, food poundings, dinner (in or out) or free trade labor also provide support for your pastor and family. Show them that you love them. Any cash love offering that is collected and presented to the pastor with the "church" being the facilitator and no record of individual gifts made, or receipt for charitable giving provided, is considered a gift and is not included as taxable income for the pastor. The church is strongly encouraged to consider how to mark all celebrations of life to be recognized in some meaningful way (anniversaries, ministry anniversaries, ordination, birthdays, holidays, and pastor appreciation month).

2.h. Taking Charge of Pastoral Care

At least once per year, (preferably at the time the church considers its next year's budget), the District office will send a reminder to each Church Board Secretary to set aside time in a church board meeting to go through each item in the *District Pastoral Support – Clergy Health* report with their church board, to assess how well their church board is supporting its pastors.

With this reminder, the District Office shall request a response from the Church Board Secretary regarding when this was (or will be) accomplished.

3. Accountable Reimbursable Expenses

Professional expenses are not considered part of the pastor's compensation package because the activities that incur these expenses are the business of the church and not the personal business of the pastor. The local church should establish an accountable reimbursable plan, as a line item in the church budget, in lieu of an expense allowance. If an allowance is provided to cover business expenses and a written accounting of allowances use is not made, the IRS has determined that the allowance will be treated as income and it will be subject to income and Social Security taxes. A reimbursement system is treated as a business expense by the IRS and is not taxed. Reimbursements must have an expense voucher system instituted by the local church to provide paper records that will substantiate the reimbursements as a business expense in the event of an IRS audit. See Pension and Benefits USA Memo #11: Auto and Other Business Expense Reimbursements.

3.a. Business Expense

This is the amount the church budgets to enable the pastor to perform his or her duties, as well as to maintain professional development and personal growth.

3.a.1. District Function Expenses

The church should reimburse the pastor and spouse for all out-of-pocket expenses incurred while attending and participating in district functions (for example: Pastor & Spouses Renewal, District Assembly, District Camps, Day of NED, etc.).

3.a.2. General Assembly Expenses

The General Assembly expenses should be treated as business reimbursable expenses. We recommend that a minimum of \$15 per week be set aside to provide funds for the pastor and spouse to attend general assembly.

3.a.3. Continuing Education, and Professional and Personal Growth

All assigned ordained ministers are expected to complete a minimum of 20 hours of lifelong learning each year (*Manual** 529.6). The New England District offers regular opportunities for continuing education. A church should provide its pastors with time and financial support for the required continued education.

It is important for the pastor to stay current in his/her profession, further his/her education, and otherwise prepare him/her to serve the congregation better. The more a congregation supports and provides a pastor with an avenue for personal growth, the more prepared a pastor will be to provide the leadership and care support for the congregation. Some professional expenses include ministerial conventions, seminars, directed studies, special college seminary courses, the purchase of professional development materials, and the payment of professional dues and fees.

3.a.4. Discretionary Fund Expense

By church board action, the church should consider creating a fund that is available for the pastor to use at his/her discretion. The fund is to have a limit set to a value and, as the fund is depleted, it should be replenished to its set limit.

3.a.5. General Business Expenses

This expense pertains to the other expenses not covered in the previous sections, such as the entertainment of visiting evangelists and other dignitaries, business lunches, and so on. This should be handled as an accountable reimbursement supported with an expense voucher.

3.b. Automobile Expense

This is the amount that the church budgets to enable the pastor to perform duties on church business outside the church office, such as hospital visitation, district board meetings, home visitation, and crisis visitation. The use of the pastor's automobile is not unlike that of a business professional in the private sector.

The portion of the automobile used for church business should be the fiscal responsibility of the local church. This includes not only the gasoline and tolls but includes repairs, maintenance, and replacement value of the automobile.

There are several ways to compensate the pastor for the church business use of the automobile. Again, we strongly recommend that the local church use an accountable reimbursement plan for the pastor instead of providing him or her with an allowance. The district office will provide an automobile voucher form upon request.

The options for automobile reimbursement or allowances are as follows:

- If the pastor uses his or her personal automobile, the pastor will be reimbursed for church use by one of the following options:
 - The pastor must maintain a record of mileage driven, both for church and personal use, along with expenses, maintenance, and repair costs. The pastor must submit a monthly voucher for the church portion of the use of the vehicle, determined by applying the ratio of the church mileage over total mileage against the total cost of operating the vehicle.
 - The pastor must maintain a record of mileage driven for church use and submit a
 monthly voucher for the current rate per mile established by the Internal Revenue
 Service [go here to find the current IRS Mileage Rate: https://www.irs.gov/tax-professionals/standard-mileage-rates]

A local church may purchase a car, registered in the name of the church, for the use of the pastor. If the pastor uses the car for personal use, the pastor must keep an accurate travel log. The pastor must submit the travel log to the church treasurer on a regular basis (monthly is recommended). The pastor is responsible to reimburse the church for the miles driven at the rate established by the Internal Revenue Service at the current rate [go here to find the current IRS Mileage Rate: https://www.irs.gov/tax-professionals/standard-mileage-rates]. Or, the church board may agree that this becomes an additional part of the pastor's package, in which case the value is to become taxable income and included as part of the wages on Form W-2.

Refer to Pension and Benefits USA *Memo #11:* <u>Auto and Other Business Expense</u> Reimbursements.

3.c. Moving Expenses

Churches should treat the moving expense as an accountable reimbursable expense because the reimbursement then is not reported as income.

If the moving expenses are under a non-accountable arrangement, such as an allocated amount for moving, then that amount needs to be reported as income. Form 3903 provides for the calculation of unreimbursed moving expenses, or a non-accountable allowance. Substantiated moving expenses are deducted on line 24 of Form 1040.

See Pension and Benefits USA *Memo #3:* <u>Tax Reporting Procedures for Congregations</u> for more information.

4. Pastoral Health

- 4.a. Flexibility of Time Off When a pastor is sick or cannot effectively minister due to bereavement, major events or crises of family, etc., time off should not be deducted from vacation time. Any situation that moves beyond a week should initiate a conversation between the church board and the pastor regarding the possibility of a medical leave of absence.
- 4.b. Pulpit Supply We appreciate the time spent listening to the Holy Spirit, the work of creative thinking, hours of study, and the loving care with which our pastors craft sermons and passionately deliver a word from the Lord week in and week out. We also see value in periodically reinvesting some of that time and energy to give attention to other areas of personal need and pastoral ministry. We encourage our pastors to periodically make use of pulpit supply sot they sit with their congregation, as joyful recipients of the preached word. These experiences would not only grant ministerial students opportunity to 'hone their preaching craft', but it would relieve some of the weekly time constraints and pressure from the pastor. Additionally it exposes both pastor and congregation to a fresh voice that may more deeply enrich the worship experience as well as grants the pastor the opportunity to worship as a congregant along with his/her congregation.
- 4.c. The role of the pastor has continued to grow in complexity with increasing demands and expectations. This has had a significant impact on the pastor's spiritual, emotional, relational and physical health.

Each church board and pastor is encouraged to intentionally attend to these issues through dialogue, the development of a plan (formal or informal) for reviewing and addressing these areas of health. Church leadership should support activities and a schedule for the pastor that promotes a healthy and balanced lifestyle.

In addition, we recommend regular accountability and relational support for the pastor to ensure pastoral health. We believe that attention to these issues will benefit and bless the pastor, the pastoral family and the congregation. The district office is able to provide resources that can assist pastors and church boards in addressing pastoral health.

Two other congregations rent space as well, and we are developing plans for unified outreach to the community.

Our community outreach efforts have never been greater. We held multiple Pancakes and Prayers events over the summer at a local low-income housing complex. We had the privilege of connecting with dozens of families and teaching children that God loves them and listens to their prayers. We returned for caroling and cookies in December, and many of the kids that came to the event connected Christ to Christmas for the very first time. We also partnered with a local non-profit helping provide children with gifts to give their family members. We don't know how God will use that act of kindness in Jesus' name and the influence of attending our VBS will have in her life. We also had a cookout and games after a Sunday morning service on our church property for outreach. 3) We also brought services to a nursing home about 10 miles from us one Sunday a month.

Ministry was not only local but also outside our area this past year. 1) We participated in Alabaster offerings, Thanksgiving & Easter offerings for World Evangelism, and World Mission Broadcast offering. 2) We've helped support with monies and prayers a young woman teaching 3rd grade in Niger, Africa. 3) Our church provided Operation Christmas Child shoe boxes for the ministry of Samaritan's Purse with Franklin Graham. 4) As a church we provided 141 Bibles to Voice of the Martyr ministries. Dear Sisters & Brothers-

It is with heartfelt gratitude that I write you, the New England District Assembly, my twelfth report as Senior Pastor & Lead Follower at Lowell (MA) First Church of the Nazarene (LFC). My heart swells with joy at the privilege of serving alongside you on this district and among the beautiful people of Lowell. What a blessing it is to know that together, as we all pursue the call of God in each of our lives, we are collectively given a grand Kingdom opportunity to make Christ known to and with each other as "faithful missional disciples" (our collective missional statement as a local congregation).

Writing this report days before I begin a sabbatical (and you now seeing it, just days after that sabbatical is completed), my words to you are brief this year. However, let me take a moment to encourage you in two simple ways.

First, let me take a moment and remind you that our success as a local congregation (I am indeed blessed to be pastored by a church that loves my family as I seek to love them) is not unique to Lowell (either in rich history, current leadership or by some secret sauce left us by A.B. Riggs, our first pastor in 1903). Instead, the wonderful things God is doing among us and through us are sourced in the pursuit of a local people desperate for God, a local Community of Faith splashing grace all around and at every opportunity that life presents us. At the same time, our success is rooted in our awareness that what makes us special as Nazarenes is not that we own the corner on Kingdom existence, but rather that we will set up life and love (for the sake of Christ's Mission- all for the glory of God) on any corner with our local, district (especially our women in ministry and those of color), as well as those around God's good globe for the sake of the Kingdom of God. I know it seems simple, but having lost ourselves in the call, providence and presence of Christ (something so beautifully rehearsed each week around the Lord's Supper), we have found so much hope, resources, and passion for the people God has called us to serve- not to mention, the Message God has called us to live and preach.

It follows then that my second encouragement is for you to count the blessings of your local congregation, our district partnership, and our global family as Nazarenes. I am not so naïve to believe that there are not discouragements (and maybe many) lurking around the corners of your church building. In fact, discouragements may very well be brazenly parked on the couches in your parishioner's homes. But the call of Holiness is not simply to surrender our lives, sliding into a petrified existence where we stiffen our upper lip and we bully on (hoping we don't lose folks, lose money or lose our building), instead it is the movement away from sin and towards God all at the empowerment of God's generous Spirit at work in us. Overflowing in us, the source of the Will of God begins to change the way we see ourselves. As such, the metrics we use to celebrate success are found in the eyes of the One who loved us while we were yet sinners who loves us now as we struggle and who will continue to love us regardless of tomorrow's circumstances. Now be careful- resting in the Lord is not an apathetic posture! We must embrace our congregational journey from our personal walks with God in such a way that we trust God has blessed us, is blessing us, and will bless others through us- simply because every aspect of our lives are becoming all about the Will & Way of God.

Blessings to you then, and may you be encouraged because God is ever faithful. And likewise, may you be encouraged, because God is delightedly watching us live in the return (to God) and overflowing (to others) of God's very own love. Enjoy the beauty of God's faithfulness reflected in you! To God be the glory!

As always, everything we have to say is a result of the active and transforming grace of God, the guidance of the Holy Spirit, and the patience God exhibits toward us here in Manchester, CT. It has been a full year of activity, and we are grateful to God for His goodness to us.

The year began at Easter with baptisms and several new church members. We focused on worshipping, training, and serving, as we finished out the school year and prepared for summer. We sent a Work and Witness team to Puerto Rico at the beginning of May to help with hurricane relief. We hosted an outstanding Block Party for our community that was well supported and well attended. Pastor Dan and Nancy enjoyed a sabbatical for two months during the summer, and returned refreshed for continued service.

In April, the church board launched a financial campaign to retire our building debt ahead of schedule. To date, about \$227K has been received, above tithes and offerings. Our indebtedness is below \$175,000., and we expect to have the building paid off within about 12 months. Our goal is to be able to report that we have, by God's grace, eliminated this debt by our next annual report.

In late August, The Cornerstone Christian School began its 38th year with an enrollment of about 180 students, pre-K to grade 12. During the fall, we hosted the NED Assessment Weekend for Ministerial Candidates, kicked off a new year of Celebrate Recovery, injected new life into our Small Groups ministry, and sent all our high school juniors to Eastern Nazarene College for a special weekend in Boston. This trip was part of a new scholarship fund we have instituted to help get our kids to ENC.

Winter passed quietly, for the most part, in terms of weather. Inside the sanctuary, things were not so quiet! The children presented a musical drama entitled "Rapping all the Way!" which was wildly popular. The annual Advent Banquet was chaotic and perfectly reflected the vibrant, family oriented congregation we are trying to be. We prepared holiday baskets for a growing number of families and worked with our local public school community to help those in need.

An annual New Year's Eve party got the year moving in the right direction, and we enjoyed watching our high school basketball teams do very well this year. We kicked off Lent with a Sacred Assembly on Ash Wednesday and heard from D.S. Ramon Sierra (Puerto Rico West) during our Spiritual Deepening Services. These were anointed services. It is our hope to establish a partnership between that district and our church. We continued our practice of celebrating Holy Week with the local Salvation Army chapter, which is always a blessing.

We lost three dear members this year, Louise Greenier, Margaret Fish and Lolalane Harper, who will be deeply missed. We were delighted to receive 12 new members. We feel that we are off to a good start in the new church year. The testimonies from those we baptized this year were inspired, and we already feel the positive momentum that comes from new Christians and their contagious faith!

In the new church year we are hoping to focus on three specific areas: Communal Prayer, Connections between Christians, and Training for Service. Our theme verse is a question: "Can I not do with you, O house of Israel, just as this potter has done? says the Lord. Just like the clay in the potter's hand, so are you in my hand, O house of Israel. (Jeremiah 18:6,7) We want to be used of God, so we know we must be shaped by God if we are going to be useful. "Once you pray past the point where you give every possible future to God, then you are useful to God in every possible future." That is our hope for the year ahead.

It is extremely challenging to find a Chinese pastor who primarily speaks Cantonese as well as being versed in Mandarin. Please join us in prayer for such a pastoral leader. Please let me highlight some sections of the reports presented at their Annual Meeting. I am very grateful for a wonderful church board who continues to provide excellent leadership and oversight.

Our church has been looking for a senior pastor for several years. In these past few years, we are thankful for God's grace and the faithful service of our brothers and sisters. Let us all continue to pray for the appointment of the senior pastor. In the past year, we were very grateful to continue to have Rev. Chow to preach for us twice a month and hosted the Holy Communion once a month. The other Sundays we also invited pastors and seminary students from other churches to preach so that the spiritual lives of our brothers and sisters were being fed.

On Mother's Day Sunday of 2018, Mr. & Mrs. Xie were baptized by Rev. Chow and joined the church to become a member. In 12/9, four brothers and sisters transferred their memberships to our church. They are Nancy Henry, Cindy Wong, Yvonne Tang, and Gene Lee.

In October last year, \$600 was allocated to the Nazarene Compassionate Fund for the relief of disaster of Hurricane Florence. Our church continues to support Chinese Christian Mission. \$400 was sent out in December as our annual offering to it. In January 2019, we sent out \$750 to support the Nazarene Theological Seminary, in which \$701 is offering from congregation. I am thankful to present my fourteenth report to the New England District church as a pastor of the Korean Church of the Nazarene, Reading, MA. In this report I will share one of the highlights of our church life last year.

We were finally able to send two church leaders to Africa to visit missionary families that the church has supported for many years. A lay leader Chris Chong and I traveled together to Morocco and Mauritania for two weeks in early February to see two families in each of these very Islam countries. A missionary family in Morocco is from the US and the other family in Mauritania is a Nazarene missionary from Korea. We brought each of them gifts that our church families prepared, including some Korean food ingredients o their delights. Other more joyous times included the worship services, the Holy Communion and various conversations that we five or six of us had together. While living in the midst of the Muslim community, they missed Christian fellowship so much and we visitors also had very different celebratory experiences through these divine fellowships.

But most memorable time took place at the night before our departure from Mauritania back to the US. We were invited to this underground secret gathering of nine converted Christian leaders. It was even the first time for our Korean Nazarene missionary who lived there more than 5 years to see this local Christian meeting with his own eyes. Each one of them shared with us their amazing conversion stories and current underground ministry works that they lead in one's own villages or tribes. They also asked us to share our own Christian journey and how God in His amazing providence had led us up to this point to meet with them. We prayed fervently to God together with joyful praises in this dark room.

Then we were led to other rooms in this secret gathering house. Many illustrations of Bible stories were attached in the walls and more sets of pictures were stacked on a table so that new believers can learn the scripture as they join in. Then we saw a worn out suitcase on the floor. We picked different Bibles in Arabic, French, and English from there. All these scenes showed their seriousness in knowing and growing in the words of God. At my surprise, I also picked up at the bottom of the bag the *Manual (2009-2013)* of the Church of the Nazarene in French. One of the local leaders of the group was a Nazarene who had come back to his Muslim home country for missional works after his conversion through Nazarene ministry in nearby Senegal.

Out of this mission field visit, I was able to clearly witness continuing works of the Holy Spirit' through the obeying people and obeying church even now. I shared what I saw and experienced with my church family once I came back to Reading. We thanked God for allowing us to be a part of His church and rededicated ourselves to His mission in the world.

All this serves as a reminder that in ministry our success is not merely defined by numbers, but by lives changed through the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ!

Over this past year I am overjoyed to report that we have had someone, who has attended our church for three years, give their life to the Lord. Over the past year we have implemented changes in how we do bible study that have helped along the way. What was a sparsely attended Sunday night bible study that met at the church was changed into two bible discussion groups that meets in people's homes. My wife, Heather, and I began one in our home that meets on Tuesday nights called dinner and discussion, which this attender who gave their life to the Lord attends. When bible study was at the church they did not attend. Him and his family join us and others for dinner and discussion on Tuesday's and I know it has changed lives. 

God blesses each one personally so much when outreach is given to love these people in this place. God is speaking to these precious people because I can see that He is working.

In the fall, the church was a part of "Hope Jam" outreach as area churches came together for ministry to the local housing development, Great Brook Valley. As in past years, the church's job was to provide games for the kids. God's love was shared as the kids played with bubbles and other games (the tables got really clean). As a prize for playing games, kids were given the highly desired food labeled, "candy" (which one lady had to guard with her life). The event had various things going on at the same time; prizes, music, free food, area agencies representing various services, and most importantly, the good new of Jesus Christ being shared with people making decisions to follow him. A great day, indeed!

Becoming a chaplain for Market Place Ministry has become a part of my ministry here. After training, I became a part of a team of chaplains that work with employees at Chick-Fil-A restaurant, a car dealership and a cleaning agency. It's been a great opportunity in gaining connection in the community through this venue. There are some perks—I get free food from Chick-Fil-A but alas, no free car from the dealership or cleaning from the cleaning service. I can only imagine.
